Simultaneously, it is important that we have greater coordination and integration between the defence and security agencies in the ASEAN region and beyond. Malaysia has always upheld the importance of the respective member countries working together in defence, among other areas, for the greater good of the region. In today's climate it is crucial for our military and civilian forces to work closely hand in glove with each other to be effective in combating external threats.

The Malaysian Armed Forces views with great seriousness in regard to the growing and emerging threats in the country as well as regionally and globally. Hence, efforts are underway to set up a Cyber and Electromagnetic Command to deal specifically with cyber threats as well as providing a holistic organization for defence operations within the cyber domain. The command is aimed at strengthening the defence of Malaysian Armed Forces in facing the cyber security threats.

Thus, the role of the DSA series, which continues to serve as a premier platform for leading players in the global defence and security industry is vital.
